Collingham Parish Council aims to:

- ensure that the community understands the role of the Parish Council as the first tier of local government, its powers, limitations and its liaison with Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council.
- ensure that a wide variety of communication channels are used to suit the needs of the Parish to pass on information from all levels of local and central government, emergency services and statutory bodies
- work closely with all residents, businesses and community groups that wish to participate or observe council meetings and procedures,
- maximise opportunity to be involved, consulted and informed to influence services, policies or decisions that affect working and living in the parish.
- consider specific concerns at council meetings and respond afterwards.
- listen to the views, experiences and wishes of parishioners.
- support the Nolan principles along with other public bodies to openly work in the public interest, with selflessness, integrity, objectivity, accountability, openness, honesty and leadership.
